This weekend during the <u>15th Annual New York International Fringe Festival</u> [3] will be your one and probably only time to come face to face with an angel. Starting at 5pm this Friday, August 12th the late great actor <u>Telly Savalas</u> [4] makes his encore at the <u>Bowery Poetry Club</u> [5], 308 Bowery, New York, NY 10012. The title of his show is <u>"Who Loves You, Baby?"</u> [6] his trademark line from the hit ABC New York cop drama, <u>"Kojak.</u> [7]" Savalas is here not here to just entertain us he's on a mission, "I'm working for the Big Guy in the Sky now." Apparently, Telly has been given the opportunity to come down from the heavens to give us all the paternal kick in the pants God feels we need.

Get you tickets now because Telly Savalas has been granted a limited time during the New York International Fringe Festival to spread his message. Actor Tom DiMenna's mom, Lynn DiMenna [8], is a New York Cabaret singer and his grandfather, Victor Del Guercio, was roommates with the legendary American football coach <u>Vince Lombardi</u> [9] while they were both at <u>Fordham University</u> [10]. Vince Lombardi later brought Victor with him to the <u>New York Giants</u> [11] where Tom's mom, Lynn, was invited to sing the, "Star-Spangled Banner" at the opening of several games. As for Tom, torn between acting and athletics he went on to play American Football while at the University of Pennsyvania and then, believe it or not, on to Italy where he was Quaterback for Italy's American football team the "Bologna Warriors [12]" in 2003. In his bio it says; Tom went on to play pro-ball for the Italian-American League in Bologna where they served tea and cigarettes at half time; a quaint reminder of those cabaret cookies of his youth. And while the Italians smashed against each other holding the line, the wayward expat Quarterback was occasioned to daydream of velvet curtains parting before him.
